Mount Jubilee Ministries is a Christian organization partnering with individuals who have special needs, their families and our community to provide opportunities for productive living.



About MJM

Mount Jubilee Ministries was established in 2005 in response to an interest to provide a residential summer camp for youth from the Piedmont Triad area of North Carolina. Due to the passionate direction of a core group of faith-based founders, Camp Jubilee hosted its first week of camp in the summer of 2005 with five campers and six volunteers. Over the years, more than 180 campers who have intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD) have participated in this exceptional camp experience. Currently, Camp Jubilee partners with the Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Educational Center in Reidsville to host camp for 48 campers and over 60 counselors and volunteers.

Mount Jubilee is a Christ-centered organization chartered to provide alternative programs and services to individuals with mild to moderate support needs, their families, and our community. MJM aligns primarily with the teen and adult I/DD population who are currently on The Registry of Unmet Needs.

MJM's core belief is that ALL people, regardless of their ability, have a God-ordained call for their lives. The founding principle of the organization is that those with special abilities have the *opportunity* to live as contributing members of society. MJM has been successful in its delivery of programs through Camp Jubilee, Touch Point seminars and His Path Developmental Day Program to assist in the growth and development of individuals who have I/DD and their families.

The Critical and Emerging Need

Over the years of providing inclusion opportunities to the I/DD population and their parents through Camp Jubilee, group outings, and numerous seminars, MJM has recognized the immense shortage of programs and services for individuals with special needs. Continuing research with local service providers and Cardinal Innovations Healthcare, our local managed care organization (MCO), confirms the need for alternative programs and services for the I/DD population. Currently, over 129 individuals in Rockingham County are on The Registry of Unmet Needs, "The Waitlist", managed by Cardinal Innovations Healthcare. Recognizing the limitations within the state and federally funded MCOs, it is the full intent of MJM to respond to this critical and emerging need with grassroots programs and services.

MJM Programs and Services

Camp Jubilee has always been recognized as MJM's centric event. This summer camp program will continue to be a focal point of the ministry. Currently operating at full capacity, planning is underway to add additional weeks of camp.

His Path Developmental Day Program launched in December 2019 as the Piedmont areas first alternative day program for teens and adults with I/DD. His Path, a curriculum base program, will serve up to 16 individuals Monday through Friday from 9 to 3. Respite care will be available as needed before and after the program.

Touch Point Seminars have proven to be a source of great resource to parents and guardians over the years. The education on pertinent issues facing families and caregivers has proven to be a valued supportive arm offered by MJM. The time of shared camaraderie at these seminars gives encouragement and best practice information to those who attend.

As these three programs continue to be foundational, additional opportunities will be developed. The broader vision for MJM programs and services will include supported employment, volunteer opportunities, vocational training, and alternative residential living.

Annual Funding Requirements

Camp Jubilee for 48 campers and 60 volunteers

\$15,000

For one week each summer, MJM offers a residential camp for teen and adult friends who have I/DD. Campers return year after year, and parents testify that their children have eagerly anticipated the camp since the day they left the previous year. MJM collaborates with The Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Educational Center in Reidsville to host camp. This relationship has provided additional programs such as canoeing, archery and horseback riding at a fully accessible camp facility. Our goal each year is to offer a one-on-one camper/counselor ratio. Keeping the camper tuition as low as possible through a volunteer staff, the cost of camp each year exceeds the camper tuition by approximately 46% leaving a need of \$15,000.

Public Awareness & Marketing

\$5,000

Our goal for outreach to friends who have I/DD and their families is to provide information on emerging issues and needs within the population. We want MJM to be known throughout the community as the “go-to organization” for information and services for the I/DD population and their families. Expansion through aligning specific marketing materials of professional quality with target audiences will need to be developed.

Touch Point Seminars (two per year)

\$2,000

Organizational Sustainability for 12 months

(Executive Director, Administrative Assistant, Program Director, 2 Direct Care Staff)

\$135,340

With the growth of MJM, the Board of Directors recognizes the mounting importance of staff expansion to guide our growth. Seeking to oversee the existing programs and advance the vision of MJM, an Executive Director is necessary for organizational stability and perpetuity. MJM currently employs a part-time Executive Director at \$32,500, and a part-time Administrative Assistant at \$10,400. To operate His Path Developmental Day Program at full capacity, a Program Director at \$35,360, and two Direct Care Staff are employed at a total of \$57,080. With this staff in place, MJM is building the foundation for additional programs, services and staff to be added as growth continues.
