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LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

While we are living through an unprecedented moment in time, one thing has not changed.....the need to bridge the gap of the vulnerable, unserved and underserved special needs population in our community. Mount Jubilee Ministries recognizes this need and is making significant progress implementing programs and services for a portion of the teen and adult individuals with special needs in our community.

Since our inception in 2005, Mount Jubilee has purposed to offer Christ-centered programs for individuals with special needs. That very summer, the mission began with 5 campers along with 6 volunteers attending the inaugural week of Camp Jubilee. Our participant numbers continued to increase over the years leading us to reach our capacity of 48 campers along with 50 or more volunteers in 2018. MJM is currently partnering with Betsy-Jeff Penn 4H Educational Center to offer this incredible week of summer camp. Camp Jubilee has been the cornerstone of MJM for 15 years.

With our hearts set on expansion, MJM announced in the Fall of 2015 our intent was to begin offering additional programs and services for this most special group of individuals. With that announcement, a concerted effort began to build a strong Board of Directors and implement a viable committee structure. We are currently operating with 13 board members from diverse backgrounds, bringing a wealth of wisdom and knowledge to the ministry. Along with the Board of Directors, 5 active committees are working diligently to build organizational stability and perpetuity.

With proficient leadership in place, MJM began our expansion by opening His Path Developmental Day Program in December, 2019 in Reidsville, NC. We are blessed with an incredible partnership with Woodmont United Methodist Church and Mission First, where the program operates. MJM is focused on extending Christ-centered day programs throughout the Piedmont. With final negotiations unfolding to open our next program in Winston Salem by the summer of 2021, our sights are now turning to other surrounding counties.

While working diligently to develop our day program initiative throughout the area, our vision for future programs remains in our sights. Our goals of providing respite care, supported employment, volunteering opportunities and a residential community is what we are striving to obtain!

It gives us great pleasure to present our first annual report to you, our valued stakeholders. MJM wants to keep you well informed as we carry out our mission and move closer to our vision. My hope is that this report will inspire you and generate a deeper commitment and connection for you to the work of Mount Jubilee Ministries. I offer my sincere gratitude for your interest in and partnership with MJM.



A Letter from the Camp Directors

If there is one thing that immediately comes to mind when people hear Mount Jubilee Ministries, it is our signature event, Camp Jubilee. As we continue planning for camp each year for our friends with special needs, we automatically look forward to the vivacious smiles on the faces of the campers as they will once again convene to help write the 16th next chapter of the Camp Jubilee story!

Camp Jubilee found a diamond in the rough when we happened across the Besty-Jeff Penn 4-H Educational Center in 2017 in our own backyard. Over the years BJP has become like home to us, not only because of their fabulous camp facility, but also the warm welcome we receive from their incredible staff summer after summer. They literally go above and beyond to accommodate our special group of campers to ensure each one leaving can confidently say, "this was the highlight of my year". BJP staff has helped our growing group (our last camp comprised of 48 campers, 48 counselors and over a dozen other workers) to navigate the grounds, get the full camp experience through canoeing, horseback riding, archery, swimming, campfires (with s'mores - must have s'mores!) and so many other fun activities. We look forward to continuing our partnership with the BJP team for years to come.



Speaking of teams, Camp Jubilee continues to look expectantly to the Lord for providing a full team of counselors each summer. Our goal of one to one camper counselor ratio is top priority. At our last camp session, we had 29 returning counselors and an additional 19 first-time counselors, all volunteers! Their task is to ensure that their assigned camper has the time of their lives and stays safe. Our counselors succeed in their mission as witnessed by the fact that nearly 4/5ths of our campers return each year. The many returning counselors and campers turn Camp Jubilee into a home away from home for our special friends each summer.

We also have a full complement of assorted faithful staff who contribute their time to the effort. There are 3 qualified nurses on staff full-time who ensure that all our campers and staff medical needs are fully met. There are also music leaders who annually motivate our campers to worship through song like you have never seen or heard before. This is definitely a highlight of my week! We also have games and crafts coordinators who involve the campers in great hands-on activities. And, of course, we have been blessed to have Andy and Loretta Burgess, whose theatrical Bible teaching ministry provides the right spiritual touch to camp that centers everything around the Lord Jesus Christ. As you can see, it takes quite a large complement of workers to keep things running and, thanks to our God, Camp Jubilee continues to do so very well.

Over the past 2 years we have noticed that word is getting out about Camp Jubilee. Each year the campers put on a talent show. When Camp Jubilee first started it was a relatively small production with campers getting up to sing a song, do a share and tell, or just stand up to say, "Hi," to everyone. That has changed. Camp Jubilee's talent night has become the most anticipated event at camp.

On Tuesday night of camp week we have a full program of singers, dancers, performers - some in costume, offering their gifts to a large crowd of counselors, staff and now joined by many guests!

There was a palpable excitement for the 5 Tate's and 2 other friends who committed to serving as counselors as we drove up the long driveway after our 8 hour drive from York, Pennsylvania. For you see, it was our second year with Camp Jubilee and the first year Camp was held at the Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Educational Center. We came to Camp Jubilee not knowing in what capacity we would be able to serve, but upon arrival we instantly began loving the awesome campers. Just 12 months before, after a week of camp, we drove away promising ourselves, through tears, that we would be sure to come back and see our friends again.

Back at home, we often reflect on those 3 wonderful summers of counseling at Camp Jubilee and remember the laughter, I mean real belly-aching laughter and the genuine and joyful singing the campers expressed from their hearts. The love of Christ was demonstrated by the way the campers and staff lived out our theme verse of Proverbs 31:8 which says "Speak up for those who can't speak for themselves, for the rights of those who need an advocate." From the first night of singing, to mealtimes, to building friendships, attentively watching the dramatized stories of characters like Abraham, Sarah and Fanny Crosby, it was clear that the campers were having the time of their lives. In our reflections we also shed tears of joy as we all shared our stories of what camp meant to us. The joy of coming alongside campers to experience horseback riding, canoeing, and archery for the first time is indescribable.


One of the more memorable highlights for all of us was the infamous Camp Jubilee Talent Show. This was way more serious than I thought it would be. The campers meant business and when they got center stage, they took it to the next level. The singing, acting and artistic talent displayed had the audience cheering and laughing along with them for nearly 2 hours. Some showed a bit of a competitive edge with bringing their own costumes to camp to add authenticity - Elvis is still alive it appears!

Most importantly, the relationships that we developed are incredible. My wife Julie still texts several of the campers on a regular basis. They enjoy praying for each other and sharing stories from their weeks. We as a family pray often for their spiritual growth and safety. Our teenage kiddos have seen what it is to serve those who many forget about, do not take the time to care for, or are simply not sure how to talk to. They have seen what genuine love is about. MJM's First Expansion!

His Path Developmental Day Program

His Path is a developmental day program for teens & adults with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities who require mild to moderate support. His Path operates under Mount Jubilee Ministries whose core belief is ALL people, regardless of their ability, have a God-ordained purpose and call for their lives. His Path is open Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday weekly from 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM.

His Path Curriculum

The curriculum-based program will enhance the participants' abilities to function as productive, contributing, and inclusive members of the local community. The curriculum will be based on:

1. Daily Living: personal care, budgeting, health and safety, social interaction
2. Education: Literacy, local civics and current events, technology, agriculture
3. Community Integration: career/job exploration, resume building, volunteerism & ethics
4. Community Living: transit, shopping, public safety, communication
5. Developmental Activities: drama, praise and worship, arts and crafts, exercise, field trips, community service projects, social situations/role play and gardening.

LETTER FROM HIS PATH PROGRAM DIRECTOR

While the last year has been riddled with uncertainty, one thing remains crystal clear: the need for Christ-center day programming for teens and adults with special needs is increasing with each passing day. We at Mount Jubilee Ministries are so thankful for God's provision of navigating His Path Developmental Day Program through the uncharted waters of Covid-19.

His Path Developmental Day Program represents the first expansion of programs for MJM. We eagerly opened our doors to 4 special friends in December 2019 at Mission First, our Reidsville location. Instantly our participants fell in love with every aspect of the program, but the unconditional, heartfelt worship we experience each day quickly became everyone's favorite. One parent even commented that "little Eddie has begun singing praise and worship songs at church now, and that has never happened before".

Searching for alternatives for in person gatherings, His Path began hosting a "Zoomin' Down His Path" weekly meeting for our participants. Approximately 10 participants and 4 volunteer staff from both Forsyth and Rockingham counties are "Zooming" for social interaction, worship, Bible lessons, activities, and a time of prayer. We have been blessed with new friends joining our circle for this weekly highlight.

Upon reopening, friends will participate in the His Path curriculum which is based around daily living skills, education, community integration and developmental activities. These daily activities include worship, Bible lessons, arts and crafts, games, talent shows, volunteering and social interaction. Since the shut down, His Path has gained additional program opportunities to include horticulture therapy, music and art therapy, health and wellness classes and tennis lessons.

His Path is very excited to announce new partnerships with Annie Penn Hospital for volunteering, Rolling Ridge Riding for therapeutic riding and volunteering, and Vocational Rehabilitation to help expand opportunities for our participants. We are clearly seeing our goals of providing inclusion and allowing participants to excel in their God given gifts and talents, even in the midst of a pandemic.



As I reflect on the past year as a ministry, I see God's faithfulness and provision amidst much uncertainty. 2020 confirmed the uncertainties of the future but reaffirmed The One who holds the future in His palm. I am honored to be serving our special needs friends and thank you, our partners and prayer warriors for this incredible opportunity.

The Noles family is excited about the opening of MJM His Path Developmental Day Program in Winston-Salem! His Path is an arm of Mount Jubilee Ministries, an organization partnering with teens and adults with special needs to offer Christ-centered programs. It has been a faith-building and encouraging experience to see God's love and provision for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) through MJM. After seeing the excellence of MJM through our son Seth's involvement with its Summer camp ministry and learning of their broader vision to launch a day program in Reidsville, my wife Amy and I reached out to MJM to meet and share our hope that MJM would launch a similar program in Winston-Salem one day.

Our first meeting was a couple of years ago at A Special Blend coffee shop in Greensboro. We met with MJM's Executive Director, Cecil Cottrell and His Path Director, Jenna Moore, and we were immediately taken by their love and commitment to those with special needs--their sense of calling, care and passion are what we always hoped for in those working with Seth. Like all parents of kids with special needs, we were feeling anxious about what life would be like for Seth after high school. He has been on the Innovations Waiver Wait List for over 16 years! Also known as The Registry of Unmet Needs, this is a list of those with I/DD waiting for state funding for home and community-based services.

Given that there are 755+ people on the waitlist for services in Forsyth County and that no one has come off the waitlist for over four years, Amy and I realize that we are on our own financially in providing Seth with meaningful experiences post high school. There are only a few day program options in Forsyth County. Even if you can get a spot in one of these programs, most families would find it impossible to pay for one long-term. It would be like paying college tuition every year for the rest of Seth's life! And most importantly, we would like for Seth to be with people who share our values. We had relief and hope when we learned of MJM's decision to bring their ministry to those who need it - they were determined to expand and open a His Path Day Program in Forsyth County!

We are finally going to have a place during the day where Seth can grow in his faith and work on daily living and social skills in a safe, loving, and engaging environment. He will be reminded daily that he is created in the image of God and that he has a calling and purpose to fulfill in his life on earth. We can't wait for the grand opening! Our heartfelt thanks and gratitude goes out to MJM for its commitment to love our son and those like him in word and deed!





SPRING TOUCH POINT SEMINAR

Touch Point Seminars provide a fount of valuable resources to parents, guardians and caregivers since Mount Jubilee Ministries inception. The dissemination of pertinent and critical topics facing families with IDD children has proven to be a valued supportive arm offered by MJM. Mount Jubilee Ministries in conjunction with A Special Needs Plan hosted a “Special Needs Planning” webinar on April 29th, 2020. Eight critical topics that parents and guardians of special needs children face were addressed including guardianship, Social Security benefits and Medicaid, The ABLE Account, lifetime needs, and tax strategies.

Our expert guide for this event was Ryan Platt. Ryan is the founder of A Special Needs Plan and has committed over 15 years working with people and families of special needs loved ones. A pioneer in this field, Ryan is one of only a few planners certified through the American College in Special Care Planning in the area. Jenna Moore, director of His Path Developmental Day Program, also presented to report on MJM’s new day program. His Path primarily targets individuals with mild to moderate support needs.




FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The result of an abundance of financial favor and volunteer support has lead MJM to develop and incredible board and committee structure. Likewise incredible is the staff that has evolved over the past 4 years. MJM began developing our staff with the hiring of Cecil Cottrell as the executive director in October, 2016. Vicki McKinney was brought on as the administrative assistant in January, 2019. Jenna Moore was hired in the summer of 2019 to launch His Path Developmental Day Program, which now has 3 additional support staff. And in October 2020, Natalie Horton was brought on board as an administrative marketing director. Each of these MJM staff members work on a part time basis.


● Income & ● Expense

MINISTRIES FUNDRAISING EVENT

EXCEEDS \$55,000 GOAL!

As the spread of Covid-19 began impacting nearly every aspect of life in March, fundraising for nonprofits was surely expected to be compromised. Planning for the 5th annual Family Fun Walk and Live Auction was in full swing when the virus shut our nation down. Mount Jubilee Ministries began altering our plans and finally had to dismiss our thoughts of gathering for an in person event. However, we were confident that fundraising strategies from years past would again be successful, even in times of a global pandemic.

Fundraising teams were organized by MJM families, board members, and friends to account for 43% of the combined campaign effort. Local churches, businesses and corporations rose to the occasion once again, giving generously to make up 41% of the total funds raised. Our online virtual auction was a whopping success bringing in the final 16% of the grand total to equal \$63,002!

Financial support from individuals, businesses and churches is the cornerstone of success for any nonprofit. Mount Jubilee Ministries has been fortunately blessed to increase and surpass our fundraising goals for five consecutive years! We are most grateful to ALL of you for your continued support once again!

In 2004, we traveled to Ecuador with our two oldest children to participate in a gospel-based humanitarian relief project – serving warm Christmas meals to children living in the dumps of Quito, the country’s capital city. It was a life-changing experience for all of us.

At the end of our trip, we met a newborn boy who had been discarded on the outskirts of the dump, naked and in a plastic trash bag. According to the police report, he was found by a carpenter, and taken by a police officer named Edison to the steps of an orphanage that cared for children with special needs. That place was called For His Children, where we met that baby on the last day of our stay there. He had Down syndrome, and needed a special heart surgery. He won our hearts and we labored with the help of God and many others, to adopt him as our 11th child.

Blessings Circling Round Contd.

Our son's name is Edison, in honor of the police officer who carried him to safety. You might know of him as "Eddie." Maybe you've seen him at Camp Jubilee or perhaps you have spotted his picture on the side of the His Path van. Or maybe you've seen the video about his adoption on Youtube (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dmocXJ5Fn3A>), which now has more than 3 million views!

We've learned a lot since Eddie came to live with us in 2009. The main lesson is this: that when we pour out ourselves in the service of God and others, it always comes back 'round to us as blessing. We thought we were adopting Edison to help him; in time we came to see that God was sending Eddie to help us!

As we have witnessed his beautiful life unfolding, Mount Jubilee Ministries has created many highlight experiences. Camp Jubilee has been Eddie's favorite week of summer for many years running now. The His Path Day Program experience has helped grow him from boyhood to manhood. And now a new adventure with MJM has begun!

Several months ago, we were given an opportunity to purchase a 15-acre parcel of land adjacent to our homestead. We donated the land to the 501(c)3 non-profit ministry our family had begun in 2011, which is now called Magnalia Homestead Foundation (www.magnalia.org).

At the same time, in God's providence, we began talking to Mount Jubilee Ministries about the impact of "agri-therapy" in the lives of children and adults with special needs. We laid out a vision to build "The Jubilee Barn," designed to facilitate interactions between His Path participants and the farm's livestock and plants. The Jubilee Barn is being designed with special activity centers to support this vision: the blueprints include feeding and petting stalls, meeting rooms, canning rooms, a pottery-making station, and more.

Week after week, volunteers have come to help clear the land in preparation for the barn-building to begin. We have planted blueberries and a fig grove, cleared the new garden beds, and more. Our goal is to have The Jubilee Barn and supporting pastures and gardens ready for His Path participants and guests in the Fall of 2021. The location of the barn in Stokesdale, provides ideal access for people being served by His Path in Reidsville as well as the prospective new programs planned for Winston-Salem and Greensboro.

All this, to us, has been a reminder of what it is to experience the goodness of God as we receive His steadfast lovingkindness, and then commit to sharing it with others. Jesus taught us that it is "more blessed to give than to receive." If we test it, we find that it is true.

Thanks to all of you who are part of the Mount Jubilee Ministries family. You inspire families like ours to stay the course, and to "pay the blessings forward" in a world that is broken and without hope. We are grateful to be alongside you!
