# LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In the summer of 2004, Janice drove 350 miles from Winston Salem to Beattyville, Kentucky to pick up her son from Sunshine Camp, his first ever camp experience. Upon arrival she discovered that he didn't want to leave! Danny had just experienced a week of paddle boating, horseback riding,



arts and crafts, swimming and Bible stories that he would NEVER forget. Janice (the founder of MJM) immediately began dreaming of developing a camp experience for the special needs community in the Piedmont.

You see, Danny has Down Syndrome, and back in the day there were no Christ-centered camp experiences in our area for Danny or for the many of his friends with disabilities to enjoy. Along with several other passionate thought leaders, Janice's dream of starting a local camp was mapped out on a napkin in a restaurant. The following summer in 2005, Mount Jubilee Ministries hosted Camp Jubilee with 5 campers and 6 volunteers.

As Camp Jubilee campers began to age out of high school, the realization of the gap in services for individuals with disabilities became more and more a reality. While typical high school graduates scurry off to college or enter the workforce, life for the special needs community isn't quite so accommodating. It is at this juncture in life that families with children with disabilities begin to feel helpless.

The original mission of Mount Jubilee Ministries began by being a supporting arm to families through Camp Jubilee. But soon the need for additional programs and opportunities grew quickly apparent. The vision of a residential community was present, but much preparation needed to take place before taking that vision seriously. With our hearts set on expansion, MJM announced in the Fall of 2015 our intent to begin growing. With a concerted effort, we began to develop a strong Board of Directors, a viable committee structure and a passionate staff to oversee the work of MJM. By God's grace and provisions, that effort successfully continues today.

Mount Jubilee Ministries is currently hosting a week of Camp Jubilee each summer with a capacity of 48 campers. We continue to enjoy an excellent partnership with Betty Jeff Penn 4-H Educational Center in Reidsville, NC for this Summer camp experience. We are operating two developmental day programs; one in Reidsville and one in Winston Salem, both of which are flourishing. The launch date for our third day program in Greensboro is set for June, 2022. And the vision of a residential community is becoming a reality with each passing day. Stay tuned!

In December, 2021, Jenna Moore (our amazing Program Director) and I had the opportunity to visit Brookwood In Georgetown (BiG), an organization in Texas that is like-minded in many ways with Mount Jubilee Ministries. The accompanying art created by a friend at BiG was for sale in their award winning gift shop. It immediately caught my eye and has become the MJM theme for 2022: “Oh Yeah! Now we’re getting somewhere”. Over the past 7 years, MJM has built a solid foundation on which to carry out our mission and vision and we anticipate another great year of growth and expansion.

Our visit to the BiG campus revealed a new dimension that MJM will begin working hard to implement in our day programs. BiG provides an educational environment that creates meaningful jobs, builds a sense of belonging and demands dignity and respect for adults with disabilities. Our current His Path day programs are similar, with the exception of the enterprise element that is in place at BiG.

Having witnessed this successful model in Texas, MJM has begun pivoting our day program efforts to include various enterprise opportunities for our His Path Heroes. The first endeavor in the world of enterprise is our Perennial Project, under the leadership of Sarah Overby. Moving into this entrepreneurial model, our Heroes will acquire meaningful job skills and have real job responsibilities in our very own enterprises.

Along with this exciting direction for our day programs, the Board of Directors has unanimously agreed to move forward with the vision of a residential community. The search for land is underway and we are excited to see what lies ahead as we continue to move in this direction. To build a vocational and residential community where our Heroes can learn, work and live in a Christ-centered environment is our ultimate goal. Celebrating and enriching the lives of our Heroes will surely help change the way our community and the world views our friends with disabilities.

It gives us great pleasure to present to our stakeholders, family and friends the 2021 Annual Report. Enjoy more of what is happening in our midst as you read through the report. Our hope is that it will generate a deeper commitment and connection for you to the work of Mount Jubilee Ministries. You have my sincere gratitude for your interest in the work of MJM.

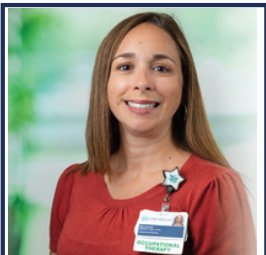

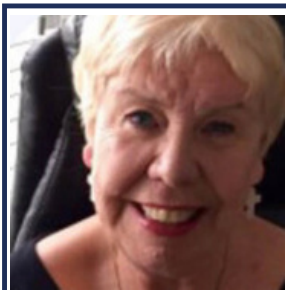

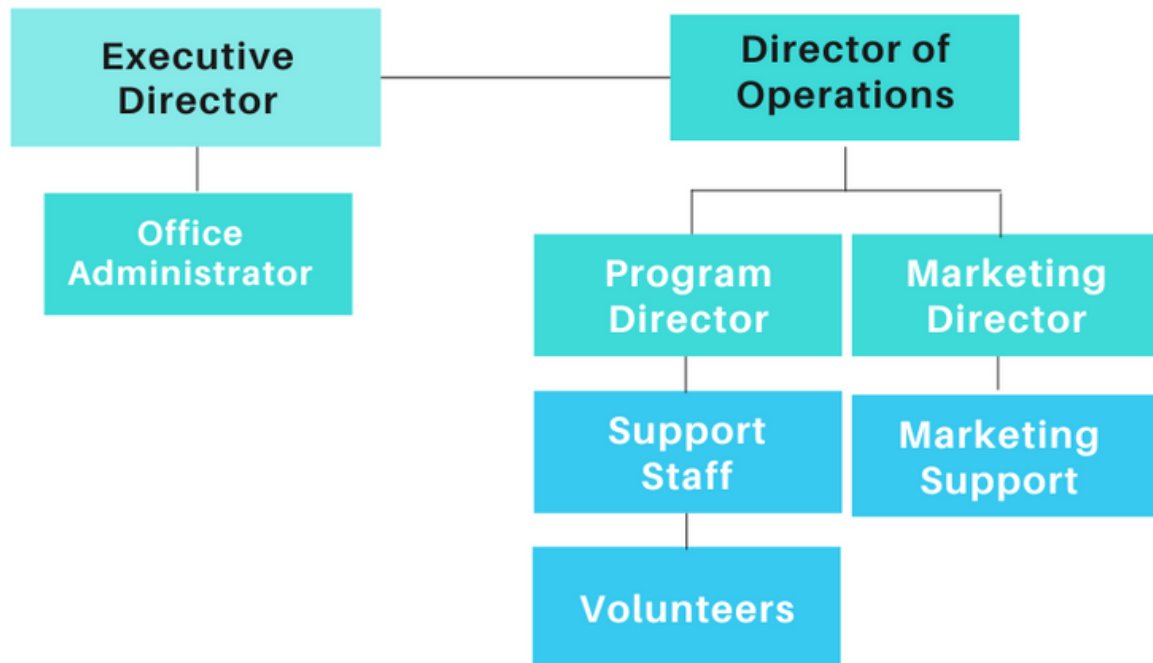

# LETTER FROM OUR MJM PROGRAM DIRECTOR

Twenty twenty-one! What a blessing to reflect on the year, recognizing that God continued to remain steadfast throughout!

His Path began the year 2020 eager to open our doors only to find we had to shut them after a week due to Covid. We desired to be with our friends, even if it meant doing so virtually through Zoom. Our participants and staff chose to make the best of our situation even though it wasn't ideal. We searched high and low for the sunshine and rainbows through the dark clouds and found them in Jesus during our Bible time and worship and in our friendships with one another. We called our Zoom sessions - Zoomin' Down His Path.

We were thrilled to reopen the His Path Rockingham doors in April, even under strict Covid guidelines. In spite of the masks, temperature checks and social distancing, our His Path participants continued to amaze us with their unwavering joy and thankfulness to be back together. While better than Zoom, we were not back to our pre-Covid normalcy.

The His Path staff rose to the challenge by tapping into their creativity to ensure we continued to offer Christ-centered, safe, healthy and FUN programming for all of our friends! We began spending more and more time outside, soaking up Vitamin D while remaining socially distanced. We had lots of picnic lunches,



afternoons at the park, line dance classes, horticulture and art classes. We also enjoyed cleaning sidewalks in Reidsville, having plant sales and a very special Mother's Day celebration. Also, there was the outpouring of love from His Path staff and participants by inviting us to their beautiful outdoor spaces for us to enjoy. After safely operating His Path Rockingham for several months and after much prayer and counsel, MJM was excited to launch our second His Path Program.

We began our Forsyth County program in Winston Salem at New Philadelphia Moravian Church each Wednesday morning in June, progressing to all day Wednesdays in July, and then each Monday, Wednesday and Friday in August. This stair step approach to opening proved to help our new His Path friends feel comfortable and at ease moving into this new adventure. His Path Forsyth operated the remainder of the year and grew to 12 participants. Our new friends enjoyed various outdoor activities, including the Carolina Classic Fair, delivering Meals on Wheels and taking leisurely strolls in the area.

In November, Rose Wimberley, one of our favorite Camp Jubilee nurses, became our fearless His Path Handbell Choir leader. To ensure we had a full choir, both His Path programs began practicing on Monday afternoons to hone their bell ringing skills. Successful performances were held at the Reidsville Fire Department, Mountain Top Youth Camp, Cafe 99, the Soup Kitchen, Walmart and culminating with our finale performance at the Reidsville Bible Chapel with over 100 in attendance. We were able to spread Christmas cheer, be with all of our friends and share the love of Jesus during this special season. In addition, we also enjoyed participating in the Reidsville Christmas Parade, Disney on Ice and the Davidson Tree Village.

Recognizing the joy of our friends from both programs gathering weekly during h and bell season, our program coordinators decided there was no reason for the fellowship to stop. Both programs continue meeting every Monday afternoon at Shannon Hills Bible Chapel in Greensboro to continue developing friendships. Just recently a mom mentioned to her daughter that she may have to stay at home from the program because of shoulder soreness, and her daughter replied, "But I can't mom, my friends need me! Yes, twenty twenty-one was anything but an ordinary year, but I have found there is no such thing as an 'ordinary year' when you surrender your life and ministry to Christ for His leading.

excited talking about what goes on at His Path each week. The benefits that Charlie receives from Mount Jubilee are demonstrable, palpable, and visible in his life every day. Before there was ever a Mount Jubilee Ministry, there was Camp Jubilee, a small gathering of just a few families looking to improve the lives of their loved ones with special needs. These families came up with the idea of a camp outing as a way of providing a healthy change of scenery and an important time of nurturing and fellowship. Bible stories, games, a dip in the pool, and of course, a small campfire provided just the right “break” from the sometimes imposing search for outlets for their special loved ones. With such humble beginnings, and having drawn in a much needed breath of fresh outdoor air, the Camp Jubilee ministry was born in 2005 with five campers and six volunteers.

Over time, and through word of mouth, campers were added, volunteers drew alongside to offer their support, and many began praying. From that small gathering, Camp Jubilee has grown to our maximum number of 48 campers, with just as many counselors and a variety of staff who provide the kind spiritual, intellectual and physical food necessary to make our gatherings one of the highlights of the year for our special friends. Anyone who has witnessed Camp Jubilee through the years (this will make year number 17), has seen the Lord’s hand in meeting the needs of

this work as it cheers the hearts of campers and counselors alike and blesses families with much-needed respite.

Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Educational Center in Reidsville has provided the full camp experience for our campers. Having partnered with them since 2017, BJP renders the perfect setting for camp with its gentle and relaxing landscape. Cleared paths wind their way through the trees to the archery and horseback riding venues or to a well-placed bench that invites you to have a sit down to meet with new and old friends.

The calming lake offers both scenic and refreshing views, as well as an opportunity for a relaxing canoe ride. The sheltered crafts area allows our campers the shade needed to mix and mingle and create memories to take home. And the salt water pool is a camper favorite on the hot August afternoons—Aaaah!

BJP 4-H also provides us with a huge screened-in auditorium, where morning and evening we meet for singing, Bible stories, the popular Jubilee Jamboree and the even more popular Talent Night gala. At the center of camp is the wide-open commons area providing the perfect place for daily meet and greets. It is here our campers have the opportunity to put a puzzle together, make a chalk drawing on the walkway, play a game of cornhole, or to just sit down and relax.

The commons area also offers us a place for lining up for prayer before entering the roomy dining area for those 3 most important parts of any camper’s day: breakfast, lunch and dinner.

At day's end, campers and counselors retire to their respective cabins pitched along wooded trails for a good night's sleep. The Betsy-Jeff Penn staff are always close at hand to assist us in navigating our way through the day's activities. We have found them to be true partners in our desire to offer the best possible Camp Jubilee experience.

Camp Jubilee has prayerfully depended on a staff of volunteers as we seek to provide each camper with his or her own counselor. Many of our counselors are fairly local, but we also have others coming from out of state (Virginia, Pennsylvania). These faithful servants look to provide for each need that arises to ensure that campers have a safe and enjoyable time. It is not surprising that many of our counselors "re-up" year after year, as they come to appreciate the joy of giving and serving that Camp Jubilee provides.

Another critical addition to our volunteer staff is our team of nurses. We have three fully qualified nurses each year who dispense meds and meet any medical issue that may arise at camp. Each camper is assigned to a nurse and is served by the same nurse throughout the week. This personalized approach of care makes for a comforting and safe situation for all.

Last year we were joined by Peter and Emily Dodge and their children (Joy, Sarah and Forest) who presented an uplifting, high-energy music ministry that had everyone out of their seats, singing and dancing to songs of praise and worship.



We're happy to announce that they will be joining us once again...so, everybody, stand up and take a deep breath...but most importantly for us, Camp Jubilee is putting the Lord Jesus Christ in the front and center of our gathering. Our Bible teachers, Andy and Loretta Burgess, have been with us to do just that faithfully from the beginning and offer their in-character approach to Bible stories that are both engaging and memorable. We ask that you continue to pray for Camp Jubilee as we look forward to another year of camp. Pray that the Lord will be at the forefront of our ministry; that He will receive all the glory. Pray that He will guide and direct each step leading up to camp, and that He will bless us with a full staff of counselors and staff whose hearts are seeking to follow Him in ministering to our special friends and their families.

# Volunteer View

For three summers now, I have had the opportunity to serve at Camp Jubilee. I can honestly say that few places have touched my life like Jubilee has. It is truly a unique experience, and each year I am newly overwhelmed by the love and joy that permeates everything about the week. While nothing is quite like actually being there, I hope you can be encouraged and inspired by what I



have to share about it. One of the first things that comes to mind when I think about Jubilee is the worship of the campers. Twice a day, everyone gathers for a time of singing before hearing a story from God's Word. The campers may not always know all the words to the songs, they may not always sing in key, and they may not always maintain the rhythm, but they always follow the command of Psalm 100:1 to "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord." I don't think anyone does that better than them. In fact, I have found it convicting to see how unabashedly they praise the Lord. They are not worried about what those around them think or about sounding perfect, and the result is worship that is truly joyful and pure.

Another thing that makes Jubilee so unique is the one-on-one camper-counselor relationship. This past summer was my first time serving as a counselor, and I can say from experience that counselling at Jubilee isn't just about keeping an eye on your camper and enforcing rules; it's about building a friendship. Because of the one-on-one setup, I was really able to do just that with my camper Kenzie. Within the first day we were joking and teasing one another. I was able to cheer her on when she made a bullseye at archery and encourage her as she faced her fears at horseback riding. I witnessed her enthusiasm to hear the Bible stories, as she always made sure we got there early for a front row seat. Even though counseling can be exasperating at times, the highs by far outshine the lows.

Next, I am always motivated by my fellow counselors. There is something special about coming together with like-minded believers to serve. Hebrews 10:24 says, "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works." That is definitely the attitude of the counselors and staff I've encountered at Jubilee. They exhibit such a unity and love, not only for the campers, but also for one another. It still encourages me every time I think back on the moments of prayer and looking at the Word that I was able to share last summer. I continue to be edified by the relationships I formed while at camp.

Finally, at its heart, the ministry of Camp Jubilee is really about glorifying Christ. Jubilee follows in His example by reaching out to and loving those that the world so often overlooks. I can't wait to be a part of that again this summer!

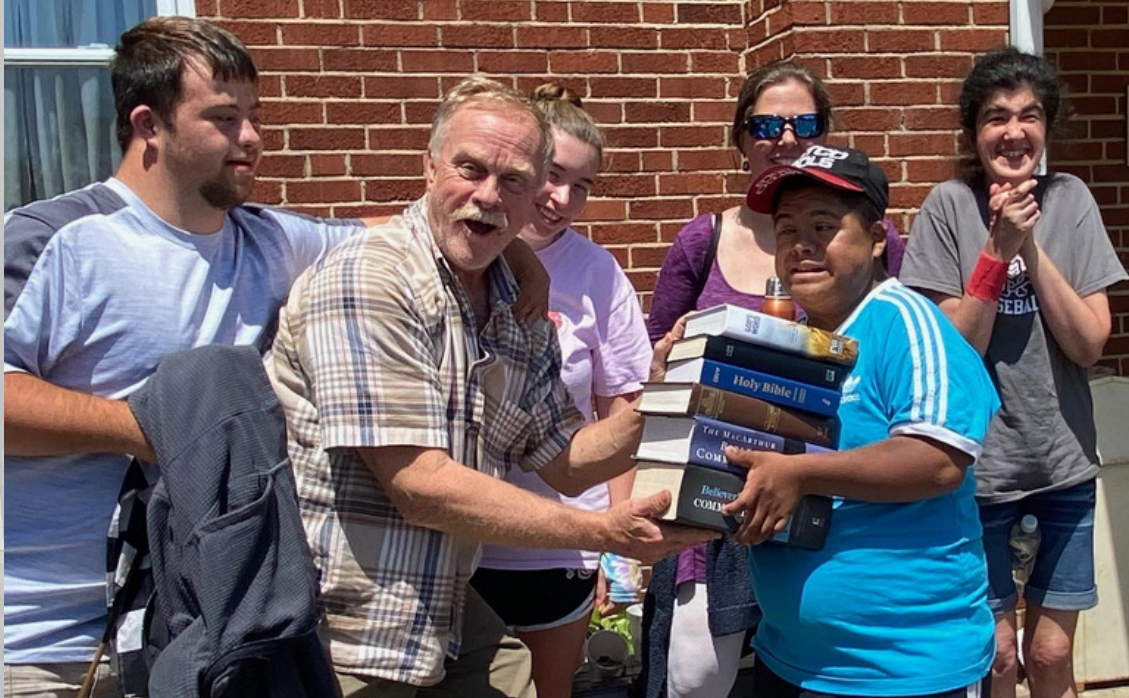

MJM is proud of our His Path Heroes for taking this project to heart and exceeding all our expectations.





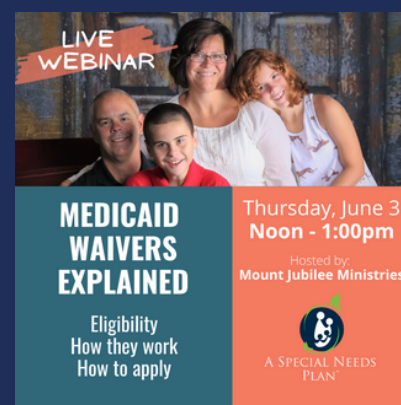
# TOUCH POINT 2021



Since our inception in 2005, Touch Point Seminars have proven to be a reservoir of great resources to parents and guardians of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The dissemination of critical and emerging information facing families and caregivers has been a valued supportive arm offered by Mount Jubilee Ministries. The time of shared camaraderie at these seminars gives encouragement and best practice information to those who attend.

In 2021, MJM collaborated with our long time friends at A Special Needs Plan to host five webinars to assist parents with making wise choices in a variety of planning needs. A Special Needs Plan is a nationwide special needs planning advisory firm founded to serve special needs families, often struggling with the worry that comes with planning for the future care and financial well-being of their loved ones. The webinars included Financial Planning for Two Lifetimes, Transitioning to the Next Support Team, Medicaid Waivers Explained, Transitioning to Adulthood and The Able Act and Special Needs Trust.

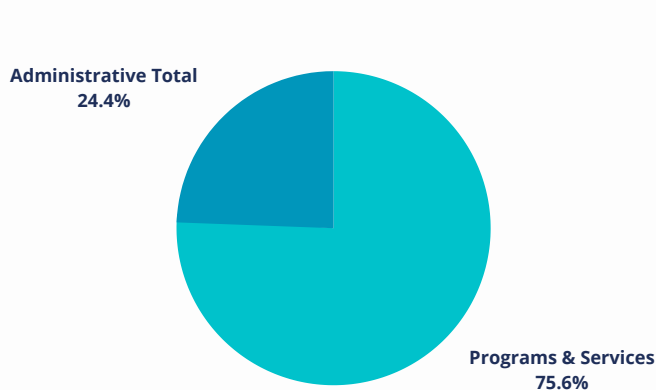


# FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

April brought the careful reopening of His Path in Reidsville. His Path in Winston-Salem opened in August. ### Mount Jubilee Scores Big in Family Fun Walk and Auction!

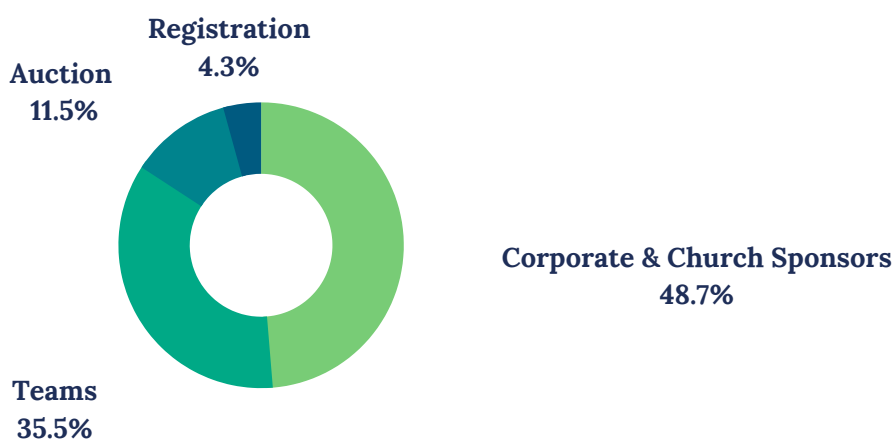

## WHY I GIVE

### *Todd & Melissa Vogelsinger*



Melissa and I didn't really start with much...I moved to Texas with an old Toyota dragging a U-Haul that contained my clothes, a hand-made desk, some posters, a boom box and my cassettes. She was starting college and I was looking for a job. We eventually married and moved into an apartment with a lot of second-hand furniture from her parents. Through the years, we worked hard, drove used cars, did without a lot of things,

raised two great ladies, and, as of last year, have two sweet grandbabies. Without a lot of spare money, we began by "giving" our time and talents. Melissa was involved in a range of community efforts like Junior League, then when the girls began school, she joined the PTO.

Our volunteer engagements have since spanned the gamut, from afternoons assembling elementary school jungle gyms to managing set construction for junior high musicals, chaperoning choir trips, working the snack bar during lacrosse games and so much more.

When the kids got older, some of our efforts graduated too...Habitat for Humanity (construction projects and work on the ReStore committee for me) and work in the Greensboro breast cancer patient community for Melissa. I also spent two back-to-back Spring Breaks with one of our daughters driving to New Orleans and participating in Katrina reconstruction work.

Now, our attention is turning to MJM, the work they're doing today and the vision for larger, more sweeping projects and programs to serve the IDD community that our grandson, Sullivan, will be part of as he gets older.



# WHY I GIVE

## *Continued*

Some of our giving has been around things we chose; other times, the opportunities chose us. One great thing we noticed from the start was the unexpected comradery and friendships that came with these things. Some of our best friends today are people we met through events like these.

Upon reflection, it makes perfect sense. There you are, giving of your time and energies, along with a group of others who are there for the same reason. You didn't "have" to be there, but you made it a priority. Something about the cause or the need appealed to you, or tugged at your heart, or maybe somebody else thought you should do it and signed you up.



Regardless, there's something about showing up somewhere and getting assigned a task, working all day next to somebody you've never met. While you're there getting the job done, there's often plenty of chat time and it's amazing how conversations can flow and friendships can form between people from different backgrounds who might otherwise have never met.

It was still pretty early in my career when I was "assigned" to serve on an industry trade association committee. During the orientation session, one of the board members made a point of explaining to everyone how "you're going to get a lot more out of this than you'll probably put in." Having never been involved with such a group, I remember puzzling over that comment when I heard it. But it didn't take too long to appreciate what she said. It had to do with the relationships that were formed through the shared experience.

It's not WHY we give, but it's an important and lasting by-product that I think people should be aware of, who might be considering "giving back" in some way. (Not that writing checks doesn't help...I've also learned that there's no such thing as a monetary contribution that's too small!) In the end, I believe that thinking people will see so many unfilled needs, or gaps, in their communities. And for those of us with a little time and energy (or money) to spare, it's actually a gift to be able to help fill these gaps or satisfy parts of these needs. It might begin as a sense of duty to take action or donate to a cause you're aware of or are drawn to. But I believe that in the case of "taking action" (volunteering one's time), the world gets a win-win. Your cause benefits, and you will too.
